The 12 EMA Momentum System

Momentum Identifier

The 12 EMA serves as your primary intraday momentum compass, revealing breakout opportunities and continuation signals.

- Breakout signals when price crosses above 12 EMA
- Continuation confirmed by sustained price above EMA
- Pullback entries on 12 EMA retest
- Flat 12 EMA indicates no-trade zones





The 60 EMA Trend Stability System

01

Broader Trend Filter

60 EMA identifies the dominant intraday trend direction and strength.

02

Continuation vs Reversal

Distinguish between trend continuation patterns and potential reversal signals.

03

Safe Entry Zones

Pullback entries near 60 EMA offer lower-risk, high-reward opportunities.

04

Slope Strength

Using EMA slope angle to avoid choppy, directionless market conditions.

EMA Confluence Logic

12 + 60 Alignment

When both EMAs align, high-quality setups emerge with strong probability.

Low-Probability Zones

Filter out weak setups when EMAs show conflicting signals.



EMA Compression

Tight EMA spacing signals impending breakout opportunities.

EMA Expansion

Widening gap indicates strong trending phases with momentum.

Pivot Point Strategy

1

Pivot Levels

PP, R1–R3, S1–S3 define key price zones for decision-making.

2

Price Behaviour

Breakout, rejection, and bounce patterns at pivot levels.

3

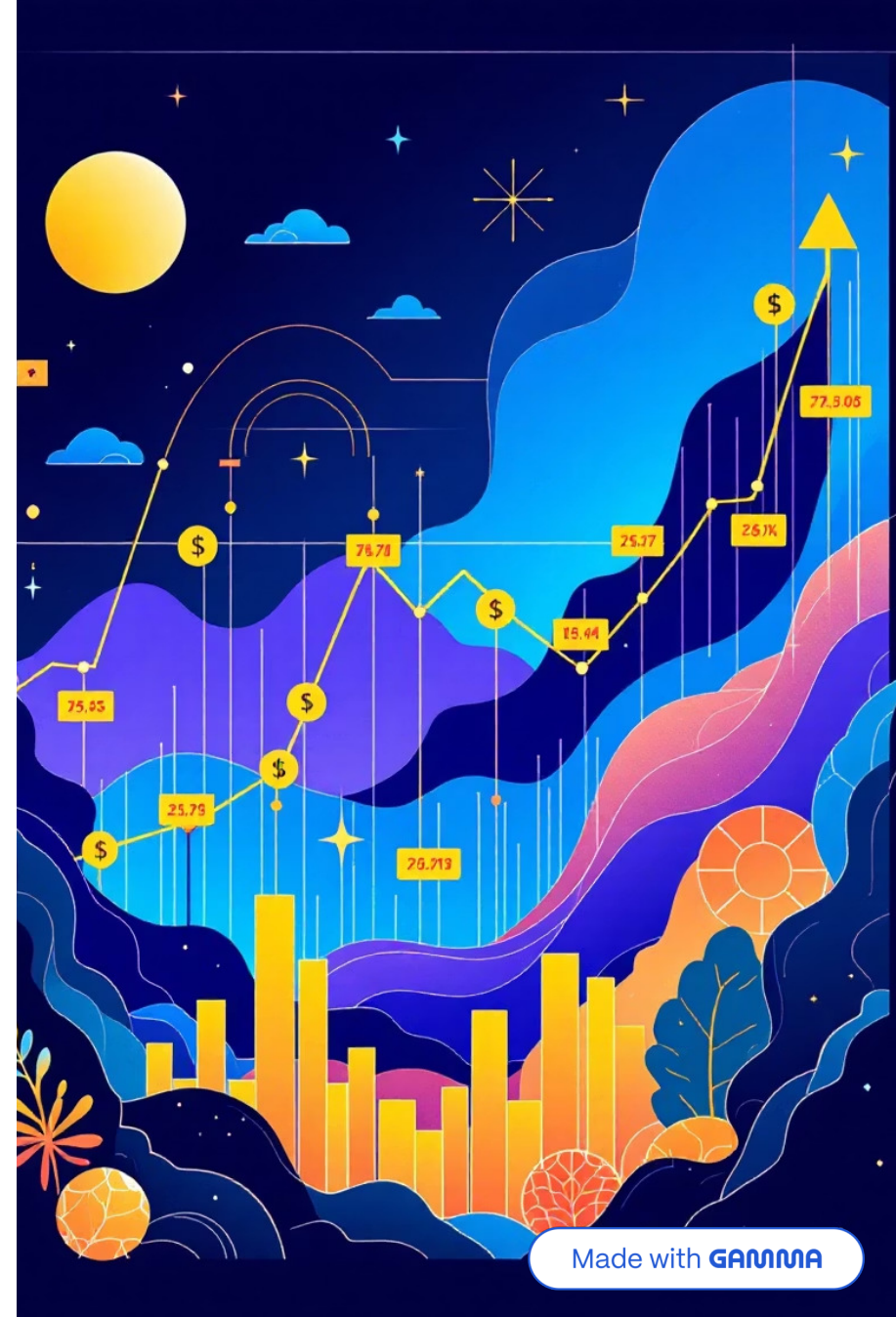
EMA Integration

Combining pivot zones with EMA momentum for confluence.

4

Risk Management

Strategic stop-loss and target placement using pivot structure.



Entry, Exit & Risk Control

1

Momentum Entries

Execute entries using 12 EMA breakout and retest signals for quick moves.

2

Trend Entries

Enter on 60 EMA pullbacks for sustained directional trades with lower risk.

3

Stop-Loss Rules

Place structural stops below key EMA levels and pivot support zones.

4

Target Mapping

Use pivot-based targets (R1, R2, R3 or S1, S2, S3) for systematic exits.

5

Avoid Overtrading

Trade only high-quality setups with clear EMA and pivot confluence.

Discipline in Fast Markets

Maintain composure and stick to your system during volatile price swings.

Emotional Control

Avoid impulsive decisions driven by fear or greed in rapid market movements.

Consistent Routine

Build daily habits and pre-market preparation for reliable trading results.

Case Studies: Strong vs Weak Setups

12 EMA Breakout

Clean breakout above 12 EMA with volume confirmation and sustained momentum.

60 EMA Continuation

Trend continuation with pullback to 60 EMA providing low-risk entry point.

EMA + Pivot Confluence

Multiple confirmations align: 12 EMA, 60 EMA, and pivot support create ideal setup.
